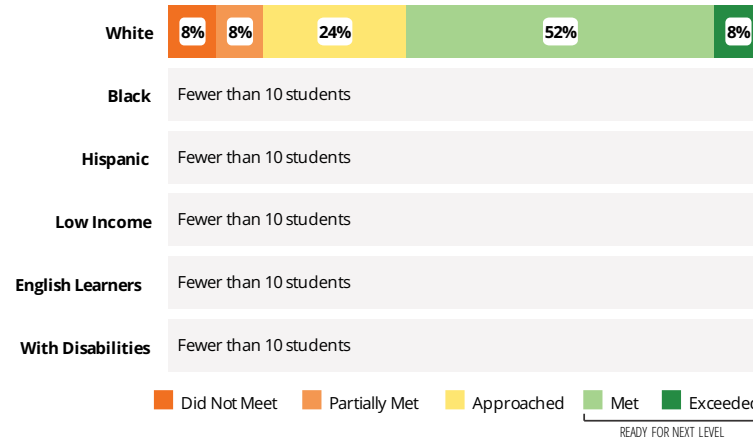
Academic Success

Success by Student Group

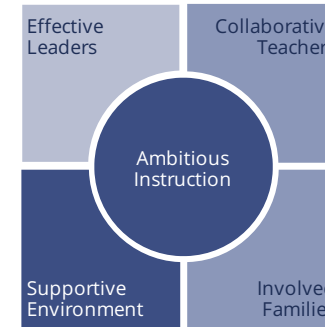
This display shows PARCC performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.



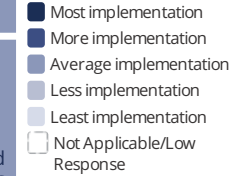

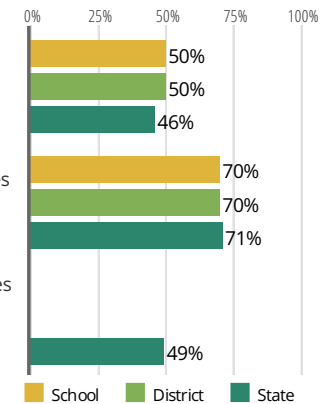

School Highlights

Academic Courses

Alden-Hebron High School is dedicated to providing students a unique learning experience. Besides state required courses in Math, English, Science, Social Sciences, and P.E. the school provides honors courses, AP classes, electives in band, choir, art, technical and career courses at the Lake County Tech Center and MCC.

Physical Education, Health and Wellness

Alden-Hebron's Physical Education Program promotes team play, physical fitness, personal health, individual play, and nutrition. The physical education program promotes integration of all subject matters including ELA, Math, and Science. Students are required to receive 3.5 credits of P.E. and .5 a credit of Health Education to graduate.

Other Programs and Activities

Alden-Hebron High School provides student clubs in Art, Chess, Coding, Spanish, Homework, Marching Band, National Honor Society, and Student Government.

School Awards

Alden-Hebron High School has won awards in athletic and academics. The girl's basketball team won their first regional championship in school history. The boy's football team was an IHSA state playoff qualifier and one student made it to sectionals in wrestling. The Accounting 1 and 2 teams took first place in the McHenry county academic bowl.

Career Development Courses and Programs

The Alden-Hebron High School Curriculum Guide provides students coursework needed to pursue a career in a chosen field. We also provide elective courses in business, computers, and have options for career, tech, and trades coursework through Lake County Technical School and McHenry Community College.

Athletics

Alden-Hebron High School provides a wide variety of athletics for both boys and girls. We are a member of the IHSA and compete in the state series for all athletic events. Alden-Hebron High School is committed to education first and has a no pass no play policy.

School Personnel Resources

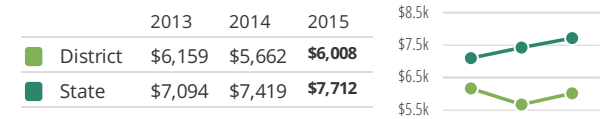

Facilities

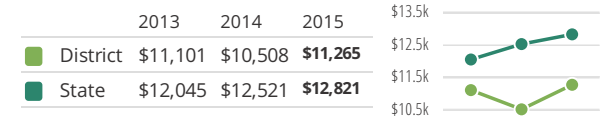
Alden-Hebron High School occupies the downstairs portion of Alden-Hebron MS/HS and a mobile unit. The school itself has 11 classrooms and several shared facilities with the MS. A portion of the building was built in 1924 with an addition being added in 1956. Recent grant money has allowed us to provide more technology for student use.

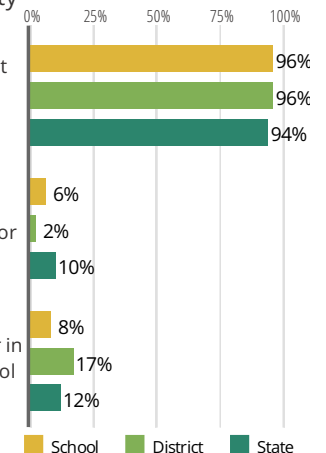
Educator Measures

Student Attendance and Mobility

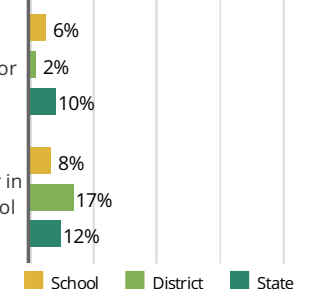
Attendance Rate

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



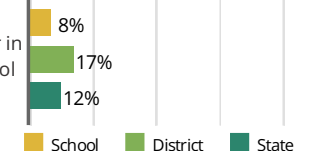
Chronic Truancy Rate
