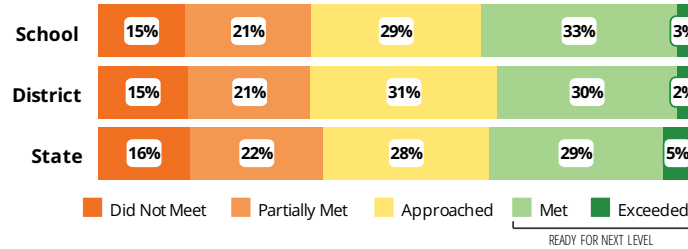

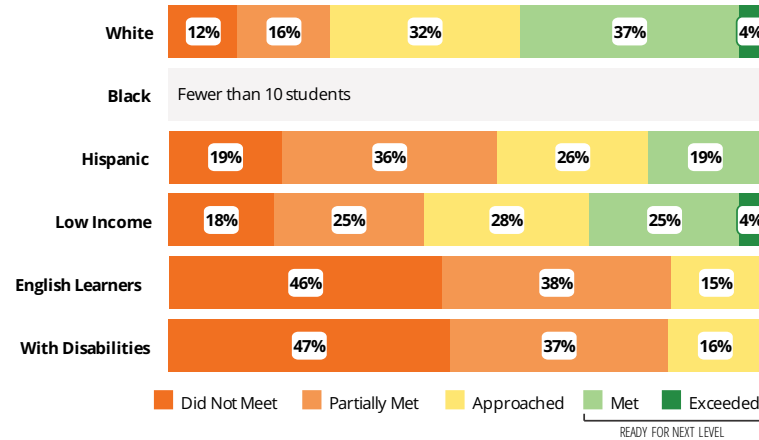
Academic Success

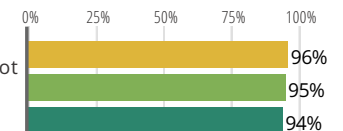

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



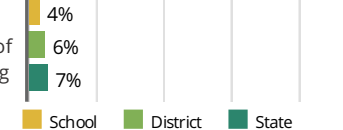
Chronic Truancy Rate

School Personnel Resources

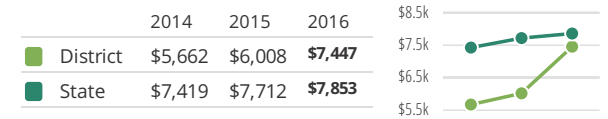

Facilities

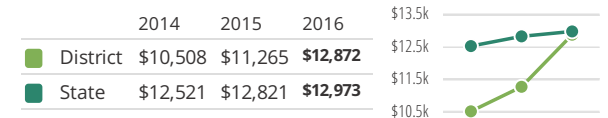
Alden-Hebron Elementary School was built in 1968 with an addition in 2000. Due to several grants the Elementary School was able to make important updates to the building which includes lighting and asbestos removal. The Elementary School has 18 classrooms in addition to a gymnasium/lunchroom, multi-purpose room, and computer lab/library.

District Finance
